

**Title:**

Multimedia Security and applications in Cloud Computing

Abstract:

Cloud computing is a kind of Internet-based service which provides configurable resources to the users in a pay-as-you-go manner. With the rapid development of cloud computing technologies, a growing number of individual and organizations choose to store and deal with their data on cloud computing platform, and thus many applications in cloud computing have been exploited. However, the outsourcing of multimedia data storage and computing cause many new security issues, such as the privacies, copyright protection and so on. There are some notable shortcomings in research methodologies. Current studies for the multimedia security are often based on the strict conditions that are nearly impossible to meet up advanced cloud computing environment. Furthermore, the high computational complexity of the current methods makes it hard to handle the multimedia big data in the cloud computing environment.

This workshop intends to collect high-quality research contributions to address the multimedia security and applications in cloud computing, with a particular emphasis on novel and highly efficient methodologies that have the potential to be used in cloud environment.
